CLIMATE
Between 70°F and 90°F (21°C and 32°C) throughout the year.

CURRENCY
United States Dollar (USD).

CUSTOMS
If you arrive from the United States, you can skip customs as no passport is required for United States citizens. Visa and passport requirements apply if you are visiting from any other country, as you would in the United States.

TRANSPORTATION
To travel around Puerto Rico and explore its regions, each with its own identity and unique attractions, you may want to rent a car. Taxis and other modes of transportation are available in most areas including public transportation, rideshare services, and e-scooters.

LANGUAGE
The official languages of the Island are Spanish and English.

TIME
(AST) Atlantic Standard Time UTC-04:00. Puerto Rico does not observe daylight savings.

Boricua is a mixture of Taínos, Spaniards, and Africans, blending over 500 years of history and traditions.

ART AND MUSIC
Puerto Rico is known for its vibrant artistic scene, with numerous museums, galleries, and murals. It is also the birthplace of many musical genres, such as salsa, bomba, plena, and reggaetón.

GASTRONOMY AND MIXOLOGY
Puerto Rico is the world capital of rum and a diverse culinary destination, with over 5,000 restaurants, cafes, and bars offering an exciting gastronomic experience.

BEACHES
With around 270 miles (430 KM) of coastline, each beach on the Island offers its own unique environment. From urban beaches offering services and activities to remote beaches that may not appear on your navigation map.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES
Puerto Rico offers a variety of activities in its 36 natural reserves and 19 state forests including hiking, zip-lining, rappelling, and cave exploration. Additionally, there are water activities such as diving, surfing, paddleboarding, snorkeling, and kayaking, among others.

ENTERTAINMENT
Puerto Rico boasts a diverse range of leisure activities, from strolling and enjoying Old San Juan, beach kiosks, roadside shacks, to bars and nightclubs with varied music in the evening hours. Throughout the Island, you'll find an activity to enjoy.

SHOPPING
A shopper's paradise, the Island has many options for shopping centers including outlet stores, luxury brands, and the largest mall in the Caribbean.

Regions

METRO
With over 500 years of history, this region has historical sites, museums, innovative restaurants, and bustling nightlife. In these communities, culture blends with city life.

NORTH
The northern karst region of Puerto Rico is characterized by its limestone hills, cave systems, and spectacular views of the Atlantic Ocean.

SOUTH
It is a region full of natural beauty, historical architecture, galleries, and carnivals. Its people will share their Boricua pride and warm hospitality with you.

EAST
In the eastern region, you'll find hidden beaches, the only tropical forest in the United States National Forest System, botanical gardens, natural reserves, and incredible keys and islets.

WEST
The western region is the surfing capital of the Caribbean and offers stunning sunsets, a relaxed atmosphere, long stretches of pristine beaches, and exciting water sports.

CENTRAL MOUNTAIN RANGE
The Central Mountain Range is home to numerous coffee plantations, gastronomic routes, rum distilleries, and the great Boricua hospitality.

What to do?

SAN JUAN
It is the capital of Puerto Rico where you will find a wide variety of culinary offerings, vibrant communities, and neighborhoods full of art and music, and it is the gateway to our Boricua culture and lifestyle.

CASTILLO SAN FELIPE DEL MORRO
Part of the Spanish legacy on the Island, El Morro is located in Old San Juan and offers breathtaking views of the sea and a window into the colonial life of Puerto Rico.

PARQUE DE BOMBAS
It is the most photographed monument on the Island and was included in the National Register of Historic Places in 1984. It was the first fire station on the Island and now houses a museum.

BIOLUMINESCENT BAYS
The Island is home to 3 of the world's 5 bioluminescent bays, composed of dinoflagellates that produce light when stimulated by movement. Mosquito Bay in Vieques is recognized as the brightest in the world.

COFFEE CULTURE
Visit a coffee plantation in Puerto Rico during the 19th century when coffee was a significant agricultural product. Some haciendas with beautiful grounds and impressive tours are Hacienda Lealtad, Hacienda Tres Angeles, and Hacienda San Pedro.

EL YUNQUE NATIONAL FOREST
The only tropical forest in the U.S. national forest system, it is home to unique species of flora and fauna, as well as hiking trails, waterfalls, and stunning views of the eastern region of Puerto Rico.

RUM DISTILLERIES
The Island has 11 distilleries that produce 70% of the rum consumed in the U.S. Casa Bacardi offers tours and tastings as well as Ron del Barrilito and Don Q. There are many opportunities to enjoy the most awarded rums in the world.

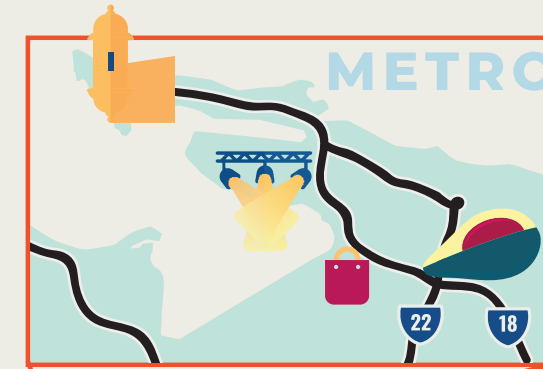


